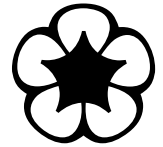

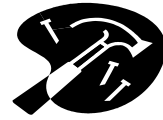

Development Briefs

Truman Center to be Redeveloped

Mark Benckendorf of Historic Homes Properties has formed The 5700 Property LLC for the purchase and redevelopment of the former city-owned nursing home at 5700 Arsenal. The developer's plans for the property include a mix-use conversion of the existing tower structure into a complex of offices on the first floor with residential condominiums on the upper floors. In addition, about twenty "villa" homes will be built in ten attached buildings on the remaining grounds and an additional privately owned two-acre site behind the complex. Two medical supply companies will lease about 20,000 square-feet of the planned 39,000-square-foot office space, with the balance available to professional offices, such as doctors or lawyers. The 47 condominiums inside the reused structure will range from 1,000 to 1,850 square feet with sales prices from \$125,000 to \$230,000. The planned villa units about the grounds and added private parcel will sell for \$235,000 to \$250,000.

SLPS to Close Southwest HS

In order to cut approximately \$23 million, the St. Louis Public Schools are considering four options drafted by consultant management firm, Alvarez & Marsal. In three of the four options, Southwest High School would see the freshmen Roosevelt High School class return to Roosevelt, for an expected annual savings of \$100,000. Combined with the expected end of the Career Academy program also occupying Southwest High School, this major institution at South Kingshighway and Arsenal may soon be virtually vacant. Even if though Southwest High School's halls soon ring hollow, SLPS is not expected to sell the school as it will be more than needed in the near future to relieve disproportionately high pupil growth in South City as well as the expected end of the city-county voluntary transfer program.

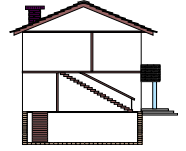

NEIGHBORHOOD ETIQUETTE GUIDE For Renters, Homeowners and Landlords



Help us sustain Southwest Garden as a great place to live!

- Keep our streets and alleys clean. Pick up any litter in front of your residence or property and in the alley, and do not allow others to litter. Use garbage bags and place all trash in the dumpster.
- Remember to use yard waste dumpsters only for leaves, grass clippings and small branches. Regular dumpsters are for regular household trash. Bulk items are to be placed the Sunday evening prior to a week's scheduled pick-up to the rear of your address at the side of the alley.
- Keep noise to a minimum, including music in your car and home and honking car horns.
- Observe speed limits when driving; Remember we have children in our neighborhood.
- Mow your lawn on a timely basis; Keep trees and bushes trimmed.
- If renting, advise your landlord about problem tenants and needed repairs.
- Dog owners are responsible for picking up dog feces. Pick it up promptly, especially when walking your dog. Remember, city ordinance requires that all dogs must be on a leash when not confined by fences.
- Inoperable vehicles should not be parked on the street. Major car repairs should be done off-street or in a garage. City ordinance also forbids for-sale signs posted on or in vehicles parked on the street.
- Pick up newspapers the day they are delivered, and consider recycling them at the I-44-Kingshighway Recycling Center.
- Move your car on street-sweeping days; Allow the City to help us keep the neighborhood clean.



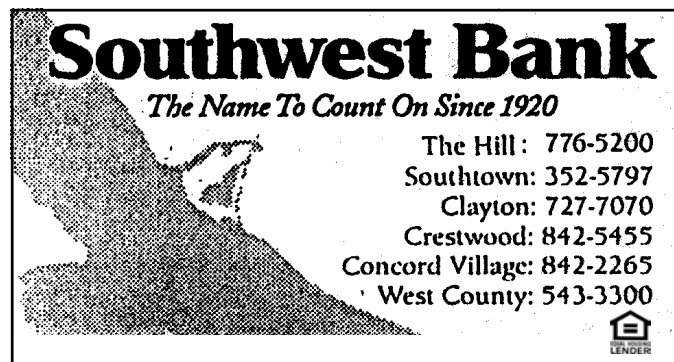

The Citizen Service Bureau (C.S.B.) is the customer service department of the City of St. Louis. Citizens may contact the C.S.B. to register complaints or to give compliments regarding city services and neighborhood concerns. Calling the C.S.B. (622-4800) is your direct link to reaching various City departments handling various concerns.

After a complaint is recorded, a work order is generated, so have pen and paper handy to write down the City department and work number. To check up on any results originating from your complaint, you are urged to call the C.S.B. back with the work order number, and a representative will promptly assist you and provide an update relative to your complaint.

In addition to calling 622-4800, you can also register complaints with the C.S.B. on-line at www.stlouiscity.com or stlouis.missouri.org. Please have the correct street address of the problem property or nearest address or numbered block for streets/alleys, as such information is crucial for prompt response.

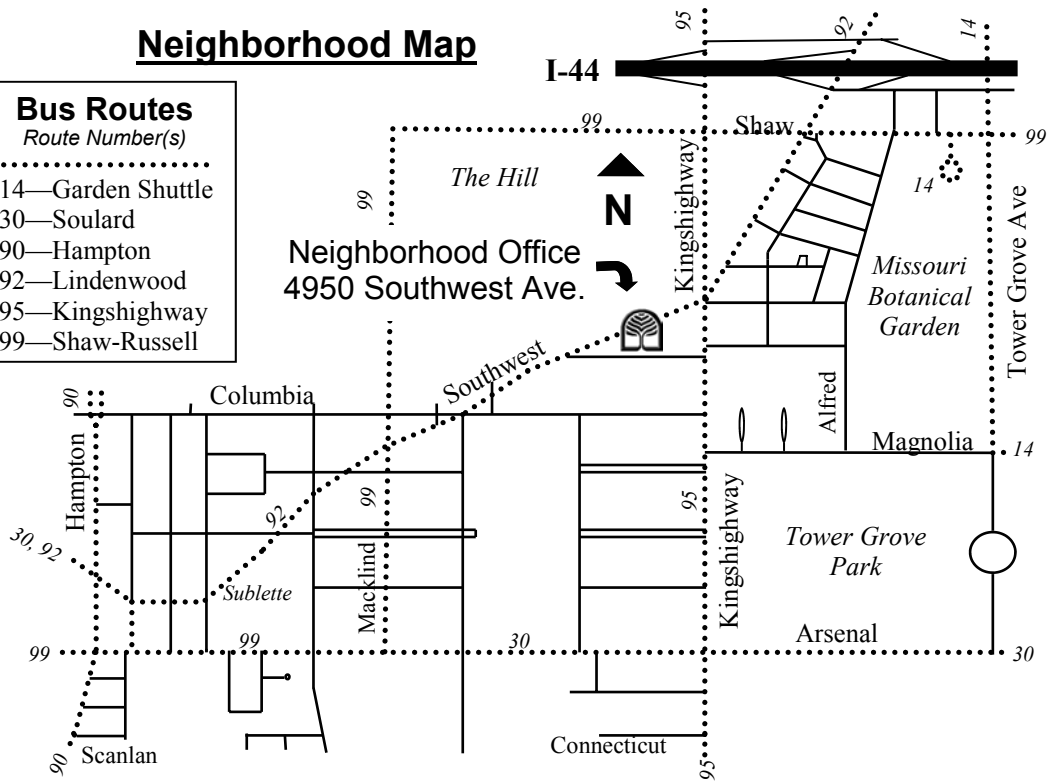
